Suicide An Islamic Prescriptive Farid Younos

The recent reports on the suicide rate in the United States, where every 12 minutes someone commits suicide, is shocking, especially when people of fame, celebrity and high profile commit suicide and shock the world. It clearly tells us that the worldly achievements is not an answer for happiness. Of course there are many reasons and factors for suicide, but the most important cause according to Islamic studies is to not know the real purpose of life and oneself.

Islam has two meanings: literal and allegorical. The literal meaning is derived from the word *salama*, which means peace. The allegorical meaning of Islam means submission to the Will of Allah(God). Interestingly enough, one cannot have peace in his heart until he submits to His Creator. But the question is, while we cannot see God, and cannot touch Him; how can we submit?
